#### NAVIGATORS REPORT

Sir Knights,

In the words of the Holy Father, "Lent is a privileged time of interior pilgrimage towards Him Who is the fount of mercy. It is a pilgrimage in which He Himself accompanies us through the desert of our poverty, sustaining us on our way towards the intense joy of Easter." As Lent finishes and we begin the Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday, let us keep in mind the central mystery of our Faith. The Easter Vigil is a unique celebration and one which we should attend with our families, children. and grandchildren.

Following Easter, we will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

Late in April, we celebrate the feast of the Evangelist, St Mark and the Doctor of the Church, St Catherine of Siena. St Catherine (1347-1380) was responsible for convincing the Holy Father to return from Avignon (hence the wine, Chateaneuf du Pape) to Rome.

We also have received word that the Master of the Fourth Degree for the District of Virginia has decided to establish a new assembly and realign some others in northern Virginia.

. Fr Sikora Council will join with Holy Spirit Council and the college council at George Mason University to form this new assembly. It is likely that the Master will approve the transfer of St. John Bosco Council to Marian Assembly. The Master is also reviewing a possible addition to Fr. Malloy Assembly. We are fortunate that the interest in the Fourth Degree in our area warrants this growth.

No Sir Knight is required to change assemblies and we will continue to welcome all Sir Knights to our meetings and Color Corps events-whether or not they are members of Father Malloy Assembly. We will also understand if Sir Knights from the councils that will become part of the new assembly would prefer to participate with their home council in this new endeavor. Our combined efforts can only increase the ability of the Fourth Degree to offer Catholic witness.

I will provide details at our April 19<sup>th</sup> meeting.

The first involves a book "By Their Works: Profiles of Men of Faith Who Made A Difference," will be published on April 18 by HarperCollins, one of the largest book publishers in the world. The book tells the stories of 65 Knights of Columbus whose lives span the entire 124-year history of the Order. The second item is also of interest; The relics of six Knights of Columbus canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2000 will visit Los Angeles, Denver, Washington, D.C., Santa Fe, N.M., Philadelphia, New Haven, Chicago and Orlando, Fla. The six priests were martyred for their faith by the Mexican government during the religious persecution in Mexico in the 1920s

Were we to examine the book and the lives of the six martyrs we would no doubt find men who were actively involved in the works of the order. 
