A review of requirements:

- Third Degree Member in good standing
- Form 4—all pertinent fields filled in, signed by candidate, sponsor, and Financial Secretary
- Check to Fr. Walter F. Malloy Assembly #1894 for \$50. All elements have to be in place prior to the Assembly meeting—or the application cannot be presented for a vote.

4th Degree Exemplification

The next 4th Degree Exemplification for the Virginia District will be on Saturday, October 31st, the same day as the Beatification of our Order's founder, the Venerable Fr. Michael J. McGivney.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and restrictions that are in place, the Exemplification will be a virtual live-stream. In anticipation of a good class of new Sir Knights for our Assembly, we have secured St. Leo the Great Catholic School Gym (3704 Old Lee Hwy, Fairfax, 22030) for a viewing. Help will be needed prior to the Exemplification for set-up (currently planned for Friday the 30th, from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM); as the school MAY need the gym that evening, we have agreed to be flexible as needed (that is, we may have to set-up the morning of the 31st). We will need several Sir Knights with Official Regalia Dress-Uniform to serve as Escorts for the Viewing... two for every five candidates! Additional help will be needed in the kitchen with serving donuts prior to the Exemplification, and serving lunch after it.

More importantly, we need a lot of help in recruiting new Sir Knights! The only requirement to take the 4th Degree is to be a 3rd Degree prior to the Exemplification, and to be in good standing. Now is a great time to recruit new members into the Order, and encourage them to advance to the 4th Degree at the end of October! To make it easier, the price set by Supreme for this Exemplification is \$50 per Candidate (the Assembly will most likely cover this fee for any Priest taking the 4th Degree!). Candidates attending the viewing must be in dark suit (black, blue, or dark gray; jacket and trousers should match), white dress shirt (no button down collar or French cuffs), conservative or traditional style tie (no bow tie or bolo tie), dark dress shoes and dark socks; they should not have any lapel pins on the jacket; any Priest taking the Exemplification should wear their clerical attire; military and first responders should be in dress uniform.

As the Exemplification will begin at Noon, we will need all Candidates to arrive no later than 11:30 AM; Escorts should arrive no later than 11:00 AM; any other observer should arrive by 11:30 AM, and should either be in Official Regalia Dress (if they have it!), or in Social Dress Uniform (if they don't). The Exemplification should end around 1:45 PM; we will have lunch available for all after it!

Historian Report

SK Richard D. Muñoz, FDD, PGK, PFN Assembly Historian

Last month, we looked at the formation of the Fourth-Degree in 1900, and the first ten years, which were somewhat disorganized local groupings with no real national structure, a period which ended with the creation of the same hierarchy we use today: Fourth-Degree districts grouped into provinces, all under the direction of a Supreme Master of the Fourth Degree.

The original purpose of the Fourth Degree was to affirm the commitment of Catholic Knights to the United States. This was a goal born from anti-Catholic nativism as far back as pre-Civil War groups—most famous, perhaps, was the "Know Nothing Party," whose avowed purpose was to resist what they believed was a "Romanist" plot to subvert the United States. As a secret society, they drew their name from the mandate of each member to deny membership by saying he "knew nothing," of any such party.

But while the Know-Nothings had withered away by the time the Fourth Degree had formed, the sentiment had not, and even as the Fourth Degree grew within the Knights, it was the subject of a horribly defamatory claim.

Publicized primarily by the KKK, newspapers and pamphlets in the 1910s and 1920s carried reproductions of a long and complicated "oath" said to be the one sworn by Fourth-Degree Knights. This concoction was filled with absurdly over-the-top vows, in which the Fourth-Degree candidate promises to slay Protestants openly and secretly, using "...the poisonous cup, the strangulation cord, the steel of the poniard, or the leaden bullet." The Bogus Oath was literally read into the Congressional Record by a United States congressman.

This was a rumor that, if left unchecked, could truly damage the perception that the American Catholic was both proudly American and proudly Catholic: it fed the worst kind of belief that to be Catholic was to somehow reject principles of democracy. The fledgling Fourth-Degree organization was equal to the challenge: the Order vigorously pursued defamation cases against any publishers of the Bogus Oath, and even went so far, by special permission of the Board of Directors, to invite a group of prominent Protestant leaders to observe a Fourth-Degree ceremony and give lie to the scurrilous claims of the pamphleteers. The Bogus Oath was eventually stamped out.

That was one hundred years ago.

Just three years ago, the United States Senate considered the nomination of Judge Amy Coney Barrett, a Catholic, to the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit. Barrett was a graduate from St. Mary's Dominican High School and a professor at Notre Dame when she stood before the Senate... and a sitting senator opposed her selection, saying to her, "I think whatever a religion is, it has its own dogma. The law is

totally different. And I think in your case, professor, when you read your speeches, the conclusion one draws is that the dogma lives loudly within you."

The mission of the Fourth Degree may have changed in detail, but the broad strokes for which we labor have not changed much at all.

50 Swords Initiative

While the number of our Color Corps activities have diminished, there are still occasions to represent the Order and the Assembly, and for that, we need more Color Corps members. To help entice Sir Knights to purchase the needed Regalia, the Assembly has a few incentives for you to consider.

First, thanks to several generous donations made in the name of our late Brother, *SK Karl R. Lesher*, the Assembly has agreed to reimburse \$100 to each of the first ten Sir Knights who purchase the new Regalia. So far, only one Sir Knight has taken advantage of this offer. To receive the refund, you simply need to provide Faithful Comptroller *SK William W. Weich*, *PFN*, a copy of your receipt after you order the Regalia, and then sign a contract committing yourself to 1) attend Color Corps Training, 2) attend at least two Assembly meetings, and 3) participate in at least two Color Corps events, all within the first year after purchasing the Regalia.

Second, over the years, the Assembly accumulated several black-handled swords from the families of Sir Knights who had gone to their heavenly reward. Prior to the retirement of the cape and chapeau, these swords could be leant to Sir Knights who borrowed Regalia for specific events. With the new Regalia, we have no need to retain the swords. Therefore, we are donating these to Sir Knights who purchase the Regalia.

Finally, once all of the swords we have on hand have been distributed, the Assembly has a standing resolution to refund up to \$150 for the purchase price of a new sword purchased by a Sir Knight during the first year following his Exemplification into the 4th Degree. Additionally, we have had resolutions the past several years to reimburse \$150 for the purchase of a new sword by the first ten Sir Knights who have been 4th Degree for over a year... this resolution has yet to be made and approved for this Fraternal Year.

A question you might ask is why is it so important to have a strong Color Corps? The answer is to provide for the needs of each of our parishes and our communities when the time arises. For example, St. Ambrose parish is working toward building a new church... when the time comes for it to be dedicated, would it not be awesome to have a decent size Honor Guard, with the majority of the Sir Knights from Ambrose Council? What about Confirmations at your parish...

would you not like to honor the young men and women being Confirmed by providing them with an Honor Guard? And let us not forget Corpus Christi, when many of our parishes ask for Honor Guards to assist with Eucharistic Processions... we would like to honor each of those requests, but can only do so with a proper Color Corps.

So, what does it take to get the Regalia and Sword? Here are the details:

Regalia Package: Order the Regalia (Blue Blazer with 4th Degree Crest and Emblem of the Order Buttons; Official 4th Degree Gray Trousers; Official 4th Degree Hand Embroidered Necktie: and Official 4th Degree Black Beret with 4th Degree Badge) can be ordered at www.kofcuniform.com. The cost of the Uniform package is \$449. Replacement parts can also be ordered from this website, as can Beret patches for those who warrant them (Color Corps and Parish Commanders, Past Faithful Navigators, etc.)





Sword: Swords can be ordered at www.kofcsupplies.com. The cost of a basic sword package (4th Degree Sword, Service Baldric, White Gloves, and Carrying Case) is \$199; Custom Name Sword Package is \$342.50; a basic etched Sword by itself is \$149.00. Please note that Sir Knights use a black-handled sword; white handled swords are for current and Past Faithful Navigators.
