My Brother Sir Knights,

December is a month of great Catholic festivities. It is fitting that the culmination of Jesus' birth is preceded by two feast days dedicated to His Mother under the titles of the Immaculate Conception and Our Lady of Guadalupe. Drawing closer to Jesus through Mary can help us become better men, better disciples, and thus better Knights. These two days are important because the Immaculate Conception is the Patroness of the United States of America, and Our Lady of Guadalupe is the Patroness of the Americas. Through different cultural expressions, we are united in one faith—under one maternal mantle. We are made into one body, through one Baptism—advancing toward our One Lord. I propose these two titles of Mary also unite us against our battle with evil. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the woman who Eve was supposed to be.

There will be three separate Masses which affect our Assembly. The Masses will each begin at 7PM, and are as follows (these are the Masses directly impacting our Assembly):

- Deanery I (affecting St. Anthony & St. Philip, thereby Our Lady of Guadalupe Council): January 10, at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More in Arlington
- Deanery VI (affecting St. Leo the Great, thereby Fr. Francis J. Diamond Council; and affecting Our Lady of Good Counsel & St. Mark, thereby affecting Santa Maria Council): January 18, at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Vienna
- Deanery II (affecting Queen of Apostles, thereby John Paul II Council; affecting St. Ambrose, thereby Ambrose Council; and affecting St. Michael, thereby Msgr. Thomas P. Scannell Council): January 19, at St. Bernadette in Springfield

We have been requested to provide an Honor Guard at the January 18 Mass at Our Lady of Good Counsel. We will be mustering in the back of the church no later than 6:30PM, in full Social Regalia (there is a question at this time with regards to whether or not we will have swords... details to follow as they are received!). If you have regalia but do not plan to attend, we do ask that you find someone in your Council that does not have regalia who would like to participate and lend it to him.
