From the Desk of the Faithful Navigator,

Happy New Year! The bustle of the Christmas season is past, and we begin to settle in for the dark days of winter, looking forward to an early Lent and the promise of Easter. For the Walter F Malloy Assembly, 2008 promises to be an exciting, busy year. As you will read in the Color Corps Commander's column, there will be many opportunities to publicly proclaim our Catholic patriotism. I encourage each of you to mark your calendars and commit to participate in at least one Color Corps event between now and Easter. And don't forget to let the Color Corps Commander Sir Knight George Billy know of your commitment. I look forward to seeing many of you at these events.

This time before Easter is also a great opportunity to explain the Fourth degree to your Brother Knights at Council meetings and events. I have discovered that good recruiting starts with simply that the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus was established in 1900, on the principle of patriotism – love for, and devotion to, one's country. Fourth Degree members compose a brotherhood united in their dedication to patriotism enlightened by the Catholic faith. The patriotic spirit of every Knights of Columbus member can be enhanced if he chooses to join the Fourth Degree.

An exemplification is scheduled for May 17th at St. Timothy's in Chantilly, and on November 8th in Richmond. To be eligible to take the Fourth Degree, the candidate must have received his First Degree at least one year prior to

taking the Fourth Degree. A six month waiver can be granted if a waiver application is filed in a timely manner. The candidate fee will be \$70.00, as established by Supreme. This will include the candidate's banquet ticket. Fees for additional banquet tickets and tickets for the Ladies' program will be available no later than January 31st.

The exemplification in Chantilly is a great opportunity for our local Brothers to advance to the Fourth Degree without having to incur additional travel expenses. Please start spreading the news and remember to carry a Form 4 with you: we have a good supply in the office at Providence Hall.

You may have heard the Pope will be visiting the Washington area in April, and is scheduled to say an outdoor Mass at the new Nationals Ballpark. Over the past month the Color Corps Commander has been collecting information needed by Supreme to establish a volunteer support group. As of now, we do not know what opportunities may be presented for our participation. Please watch for email (our best communications medium), come to the monthly meetings or contact the officers of the Assembly. We'll get the word out as quickly as we know things. Finally, let me tell you an important lesson I have relearned over the recent Christmas holidays. There is no force on Earth more powerful than the Father's love for each of us. He works in mysterious ways, and always with a purpose. My 87-year old Mother went into the hospital on the Saturday before Christmas with pneumonia. One of my sisters drove over 12 hours to be by her side, arriving on Christmas Eve. She stayed in the hospital with

her, sleeping in a bedside chair, so I could do the things away from the hospital I needed to support Mom, attend to my religious and Knights' duties, and try to provide some continuity through the ordeal for my family. Despite the severity of her illness, a fall in the hospital, and an unexplained episode that appeared to be a stroke, my Mother, the "energizer bunny" to her family, is in rehab and hoping to be home soon. My sister had to leave, because though "man does not live by bread alone" earning the bread is still a family obligation! My Mother's journey through the medical community this Christmas did serve to rekindle a family relationship that was dimming through time and distance. I KNOW the power of prayer and love, and the guiding hand of the Father through the Holy Spirit, served to help my Mother in her time of direst need, rekindle a closer relationship with my sister, and provide my family the support they needed. As we step into the "dark days of winter" let us look to the promise of Easter and Christ's salvation for the world to light our way.

Sir Knights


