## The Call of Duty



David Kripps, 42 missed the birth of his third child, a son, Allen, 12 months ago because he was on duty in Iraq. In the tradition of so many who have gone before him, he was honoring the Call of Duty.

Not a day goes by when across this great land we do not see reminders of those who have heard and heeded the call of duty. Whether they have risen to the occasion in a foreign land or just across the street; or whether they did it yesterday, today or several years ago, these individuals have given of themselves so that others might enjoy freedom. We all know some of these patriots. Perhaps we have seen them marching in parades, perhaps they are friends or relatives. Perhaps you are one of these gallant citizens.

We will soon recognize the contributions of so many when we celebrate Memorial Day. Take a moment to attend Mass on Memorial Day weekend. Fairfax Memorial Park on Braddock Road will be the location for the diocesan mass as it has been in previous years and I urge you to attend. The Mass will be at 11:00am on Monday. May 31st. The celebrant will be Father Christopher J. Pollard of St. Agnes parish. The 4th Degree Color Corps has been asked to be in attendance. I am not sure which Assembly will have the lead. An e-mail will go out as we get closer to the event. But no matter which Assembly has the lead, come in your regalia if you can. Or if not, and you are spending the weekend in this area just consider attending wearing your 4th Degree name badge.

According to an on the spot report from the Fair Haven Council 8372 in New Haven, Ct., Kripps above said he didn't think about missing events at home. Instead, he focused on his job helping to build hospitals and provide mechanical services for efforts of U.S. troops involved in Operation Iraqi Freedom. "You think about what you're supposed to do." Kripps, a U.S. Navy reservist told his brother Knights during a presentation arranged by his Council. "We pray in freedom here; we can walk down the street in freedom." "The Iraqi children now have those freedoms that my children have," said Kripps.

He was presented with a special certificate acknowledging his "selfless sacrifice and patriotism" by Supreme Master of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree, Nestor V. Barber. He said his office had received reports of 550 Knights currently on duty in Iraq and Afghanistan, or recently returned.

A certificate is now available from Supreme to honor such individuals. If you know of anyone in your Council or in our Assembly, please give me a call or send me an e-mail. I would like to arrange for them to receive such a certificate.

And this Memorial Day shake the hand and pat on the back those in your life who gave of themselves through military duty at home or abroad so that we all can continue to enjoy the freedom that is America. And remember in your prayers those who have died in service of their country throughout the history of this great land. Thank God for all those who have answered the Call of Duty.

Worthy Sir Knights,

This month, each of us takes time to honor that one special woman in our lives that mean more to us than anything else: MOM. We remember all the sacrifices that our mothers made for us, from giving us birth to raising us to be the good Catholic gentlemen that we are. We remember the tender love each showered us with, and we express both our sincerest and heartfelt gratitude and love for them.

In doing so, however, we must not lose sight of another special woman, a woman who is mother to us all. As He was dying on the cross, Christ turned to His mother, Mary, and told her to behold her son; He then turned to St John and told him to behold his mother. St Louis de Montfort explains that when we pray to Mary, she takes our request and perfects before giving it Christ.

During this Marian month, let us all take the time to not only honor our mothers, but let us also honor our blessed mother, Mary. Let us pray to her that she intercedes on our behalf.


