Today members of the Order are found in the United States, Canada, Mexico, the Philippines, Puerto Rico, Guatemala, Panama, Cuba, Guam, the Virgin Islands, the Dominican Republic, the Bahamas and most recently into Poland. The good works of the order are too numerous to mention in this brief report but are well known to all Knights throughout the world. We must do all in our power to insure that the Order continues to grow and its good works spreads. One of the guiding principles of the Knights of Columbus has long been: "Don't keep the Faith – spread it!"

We can all do our part to aid in this growth by an active participation in the works of the Order and by doing all in our power to sustain the growth of our Order. To this end, we members of the 4th Degree shall have two opportunities to increase our membership. There will be an exemplification of the 4th Degree on Saturday, May 19th at Norfolk Council 367 in Norfolk and later in the year another Exemplification will be held on October 20th at the Holiday Inn Koger Center in Richmond. Please make an effort to bring these exemplifications to the attention of your home council. Now is the time to begin recruiting candidates of either of these two degrees. The Pilot's Portal SK Bill Weich

In this month's edition of the Pilot's Portal, I will reflect on Memorial Day and

its history in our country. Please excuse me if you previously read this in last year's May edition. Memorial Day is celebrated each May in the United States to remember those who gave their lives so that our country may remain free. There are many stories about how Memorial Day came into being. But, Memorial Day was officially proclaimed on May 5, 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Potomac, and was first observed on May 30, 1868. On this date, flowers were placed on graves of Union and Confederate soldiers At Arlington National Cemetery. New York, in 1875, was the first state to recognize Memorial Day and by 1890 it was celebrated by all of the northern states. Southern states refused to join the celebration of Memorial Day until after World War II. In 1971, Congress established Memorial Day as a national holiday to be celebrated on the last Monday in May. One notable fact: some southern states observe Memorial Day and another day to honor the Confederate soldiers who perished in the great U.S. Civil War. It is common practice to fly our American Flag on Memorial Day, but I ask all my Brother Sir Knights to fly your flag not just on Memorial Day, but everyday. Let us remind our neighbors, friends, relatives, and especially our men and women in the armed forces that we will continue to support them in their duties and responsibilities – defending our United States.

In closing this month, I ask for your prayers for the following Sir Knights and/or their families: Brother Jeremy Hersbritt (a victim in the VA Tech killings); LTC Scopellite's mother; Faithful Friar and Rev Cedric Wilson and his mother; SK and PFN Jay Cabacar's mother, 1st cousin, and granddaughter, and the repose of the soul of Faithful Navigator Tom Kelley's aunt, a Sister of 75 years. I also request that we continue to pray for the other victims of the tragic killings at Virginia Tech and their families.




The Commander's Corner SK George Billy
