Worthy Sir Knights,

Over the course of this fraternal year, I have written about the virtues of our Order: Patriotism, Fraternity, and Unity. As the fraternal year comes to a close, I would like to take a moment to reflect on the first, and perhaps greatest virtue of our Order—Charity. Charity can mean different things to different people. And over time, the definition of charity has changed. The word charity originated in late Old English to mean a "Christian love of one's fellows," and up until the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, this meaning remained synonymous with charity. While in more modern times, the meaning of charity has shifted from one of "Christian love" to that of providing for those in need, generosity, and giving.

We can draw our inspiration for charity back to scripture. In some biblical translations charity is synonymous with the word agape or love. As Fr. John A. Hardon, S.J., writes in his <u>Modern Catholic Dictionary</u>, charity is the "infused supernatural virtue by which a person loves God above all things for His [that is, God's] own sake, and loves others for God's sake." While charity can and should involve monetary contributions to support those in need, the Bible also highlights the importance of acts of charity. When Peter and John met a crippled beggar, rather than give the man coins, Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk" (Acts 3:6). Charity is giving of whatever resources we have, including our own time and attention, in order to meet the need of another.

As Sir Knights, it is right that our charity should not only consist of donations of money, but in donations of our time to others. This last month, we had an exceptional example of charity through good works when we provided an honor guard and cheering supporters for a group of veterans arriving on an Honor Bus tour. The real value of this charitable act of respect and admiration can be seen in the faces of the veterans, some very weathered by time, as they pass down the honor guard line—some smile, some have "watery" eyes, some simply nod and give a quick salute, all are visibly touched. I want to thank **SK Vince Wilson** for again organizing this opportunity for the Assembly to give back to those who gave so much for our country.

It is our honor and duty as Sir Knights to be able to proudly show our patriotism and our Christian love through charitable acts for our fellow man. I am proud of the tradition of giving that our Assembly has. As we move from one fraternal year into the next, let us all keep looking for these opportunities to give of ourselves and live the virtues of our Order.



This Priestly blessing in the Mass hearkens back to the early time of the Church which were not always peaceful. Nonetheless, it was, and is a statement of hope inspired by the beatific vision that leads the faithful to higher belief.

We can ask: why did people in those times leave their pagan beliefs and practices for the rigorous rules of Christianity? For two reasons. The first was the faith in practice in the early church as attested by ancient writers. Christians as a group led better (holier) lives. They sacrificed to serve one another in a way that challenged even the jaded consciences of Romans. Perhaps even more important was the message—anyone could Page 3

have a blissful life after death. In the ancient faiths, such a thing could only be hoped for by kings and pharaohs. The resurrection of the body, promised and proved to us by Christ's own resurrection, is what defeated the old cults.

The hope of a happy afterlife is what still sets us apart from the secular confusions of today. But we must stay with the fonts of Scripture and Tradition for daily inspiration and guidance toward that goal. And very importantly, always be considering who we can bring with us to the Kingdom of God.
