And aren't we are off to a great start? At the Exemplification our Assembly was honored as being the Assembly that had the greatest growth in the Commonwealth of Virginia. And indeed we did. Thanks to efforts of your fellow Sir Knights who talked up the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree at their Council meetings and among the brother Knights on other occasions, Father Walter F. Malloy Assembly could boast of bring in fifty-one new members this year. It has been a goal of the Assembly for several years to bring in 50 members at the annual fall exemplification. Well this year we did it! Congratulations to our Faithful Navigator SK Tom Snee and all those who turned in those Form 4 applications. Each Grand Knight has pre-planned a place for a report from the 4th Degree at each regular Council meeting. Be sure that GK asks for the report and then be sure that a 4th Degree member gives a report. A couple of mentions from items in our Navigator newsletter will do the trick. Just don't say "no report." That is ok for trustees (who rarely need to report) but it is not ok for the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. This will stir up interest in the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree among council members. Then follow-up on that interest by talking about a few of the 4th Degree activities during your council's social time or good of the order.

A couple of years back as I was working through the chairs in my council I made a goal for myself. The objective was to get every serving officer to be a 4<sup>th</sup> Degree member by the time I was a PGK. It took me a year longer than my plan. But the goal was met at this year's Exemplification. I can now say that every serving officer of Council 8600 (including our Financial Secretary, Chaplain and all the Trustees) is a member of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. This was accomplished not just through my efforts. It was achieved through the combined efforts of all the 4<sup>th</sup> degree members in the council. In fact, as the number of 3<sup>rd</sup> degree officers who were 4<sup>th</sup> degree members grew, the recruiting became easier and easier. The last few dropped like manna.

Now that we have the greatest increase in membership of any Assembly in the Commonwealth of Virginia, we all need to make an extra effort to welcome these new members into our midst. We need to encourage them to come to a few meetings and to check out the Color Corps. If each of the new Sir Knights participated in only two of our activities during the fraternal year, we would have 102 more fellow Sir Knights doing the work of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree.

Congratulations to our new exemplified fellow Sir Knights. Come to a couple of meetings in the next few months. Ask about how you can earn a free Sword.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Degree is a lot more than just the final and highest degree in the order. It is that – but it is also a wonderful opportunity to serve your order and your church in a very visible way. It is a way to become acquainted with Knights from other councils. Consider doing four events a year. I am sure you can squeeze that it. You see, it really doesn't take much time to be a bit active and you will enjoy it. I guarantee it.

#### 4th Degree Exemplification

Saturday, 11/2/02, The Bernice C Williams Exemplification Corps of the Calvert Province, for the 37th time, delivered their superior rendition of the 4th Degree Exemplification at the Fairview Park Marriott in Falls Church, VA.

This year's honoree was Rev. Julius J "The Chief" Cilinski, 93 years young, 57 years a faithful priest, servant of God and His Church. Of the 288 candidates, 51 were from Fr. Malloy Assembly.

Fr. Malloy was awarded Most Improved and Assembly of the Year for Membership; the "To Be A Patriot" award went to Acts of Apostles Assembly in Rappahannock; Marian Assembly was awarded Assembly of the year; and Sir Knight of the Year went to our very own Faithful Comptroller, SK Larry Novack.

According to Master J P McCusker, 808 dinners were served, a record number. The next Exemplification is to be held in Virginia Beach, and is scheduled for Nov. 12, 2003. n November we celebrate the Veterans Day. This holiday, Lareated by Congress was established to pay tribute to those men and women who served in defense of their country. In the early days of the United States many brave men took up arms to secure a freedom they didn't have, many losing everything they owned, even their lives. Throughout our history, there were numerous times when our freedom was threatened and countless patriotic souls volunteered their services. Following World War, the War to End All Wars, every November 11<sup>th</sup> memorial gestures were celebrated giving universal recognition to the end of the fighting at 11 AM, November 11th, 1918. This day became known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day received official recognition in 1926 by a Congressional resolution and in 1938 it became an official US holiday by Congressional action. Unfortunately, a few years later World War 2 broke out ending the Armistice. In 1954 President Eisenhower signed a Bill declaring November 11<sup>th</sup> Veterans Day, to honor all those who served in all wars. In 1968, Congress, in its desire to create more three-day weekends moved Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October. It soon became apparent to many Americans the importance of the date of November 11th. Therefore, in 1978, Congress moved it back to its original date. Although we do not have any specific event scheduled on November 11<sup>th</sup> we still need to take a moment to remember those who served to keep our country safe and free.

On November 2 the District of Virginia, Calvert Province held its annual exemplification to induct new members. Fr. Walter Malloy Assembly inducted around 50 new members itself. Congratulations to the new members, and thank you to the members who sponsored the new Sir Knights.


